REGULAR MEETING
of the City Commission
July 16, 1992
8:15 p.m.

Mayor Beyer called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m. at City Hall, located at 3915 Cottonwood Drive, Cottonwood Shores, Texas. Commissioners Adrian Gawlik and Mike Butler were in attendance.

The Financial Report for the month of June was read. Commissioner Gawlik made a motion to approve the report as read. Commissioner Butler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Minutes of the June 18, 1992 meeting were read. Mayor Beyer suggested we correct the Minutes to read, Mayor Beyer read Ordinance #61892-1A amending Ordinance #091001-1A the Budget Ordinance. We should also specify the amounts. The increase for Administrative Department appropriations for Grant Engineering expenditures by \$11,400 and for Garbage Department appropriations for Miscellaneous Expenditures by \$2,500. Commissioner Butler made a motion to approve the minutes with the corrections Mayor Beyer suggested. Commissioner Gawlik seconded the motion. Motion carried.

During open discussion Mayor Beyer explained that he had been in contact with Alan Cunningham, a County Commissioner to try and sealcoat Pecan Lane as a County/City project. Our cost would be \$2,400 to \$2,500. We have to buy the oil and crushed rock and the County would provide the equipment and personnel. We should be able to do all of Pecan Lane.

We have been in contact with the Highway Department to have a City Limits sign put up. Where our problem lies, is the City only goes to the right-of-way of 2147. If we meet the criteria they require, they will put up signs at no cost to us.

Mayor Beyer explained that there were approximately \$35,000 in delinquent Maintenance Fees. This is a very unrealistic number because about \$15,000 of that is represented by about 15 accounts. These go back so many years it is virtually impossible to collect. We have collected approximately \$1,500. We have sent out letters to people who owe \$500 or less, approximately 300 letters. We have received a good response from the mailout. Some have said they have never received a notice. If we collect \$12,000 we will be way ahead of the game.

Street work has been started thanks to Joe Short. Some pot-holes have been repaired, and some streets have been mowed. The grader has had a new battery installed and is now running. Maintenance work has been don on the riding mower. We have mowed some property for a few owners. The next thing to do is to trim the tree limbs that are hanging so low.

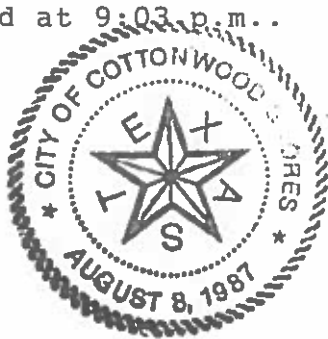
