

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS
HELD AT 4111 COTTONWOOD DRIVE – CIVIC CENTER
ON THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 2000 AT 7:00 P.M.**

1. **CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL:** Mayor Pickens called this Regular Meeting to Order at 7:02 pm, with both Commissioner Phipps and Commissioner Pfeifer in attendance, a Quorum was present.
2. **CONSENT AGENDA:**
 - A. **MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING ON OCTOBER 25, 2000:** Commissioner Pfeifer made a motion to approve the minutes of the Special Meeting held on October 25, 2000 as recorded. Commissioner Phipps seconded his motion, which carried.
 - B. **FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE MONTHS OF SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER 2000:** Mayor Pickens stated the accountant was still working on the October statement so the Council would only be considering the September statement. He added he had sent the preview copy back to the accountant for some minor adjustments. He had reviewed the revised copy, which appeared to be in order. Commissioner Pfeifer stated he had no questions. Commissioner Phipps then made a motion to approve the Financial Statements for September 2000. Commissioner Pfeifer seconded her motion, which carried.
3. **PEDERNALES ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE QUARTERLY PRESENTATION GIVEN BY MR. WAYNE MCKEE AND MR. GEORGE BIRD:** Mr. George Bird introduced Mr. Wayne McKee and Ms. Lanelle McAllister both with PEC. Mr. McKee stated PEC tries to send a representative to each city every quarter. He added he would try and stop by each city at least once a year. He announced that PEC had bought Kimball County CoOp., which brought the number of counties in which PEC served to eight. He explained the new credit card payment option now available at PEC. He stated leveled billing was a new service at PEC. This would take out the peaks in the summer or high use months. He added that the remote meter program was now available. This service is for customers who travel or have meters in hard to read areas. The meter reading is obtained over the phone line automatically. He encouraged everyone to call the office and get set up if they were interested. He added there was a lot of new technology coming down the road and PEC was looking to do more all the time. He noted that deregulation was coming, too. He stated things would not change at PEC. They would continue maintaining lines and keeping everyone's lights on. He noted that people would be calling, however, offering special deals to get customers to switch electric companies. He added you could get on a list to not have those calls if you wish. He stated to call the PEC office for the phone number to call if you wanted your name on the list.
4. **MS. LINDA CLARK TO GIVE INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION REGARDING ORDINANCE NO. 031193, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS PROHIBITING CERTAIN ANIMALS OR FOWL; REQUIRING RESTRAINT OF ANIMALS AND FOWL; PROVIDING FOR ISSUANCE OF ANIMAL PERMITS; AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS:** Mayor Pickens introduced Ms. Linda Clark who address the Council about concerns she had about Ordinance No. 031193. She stated the reason we have ordinances was to keep peace between neighbors. She stated she had to put her cocker spaniel down on October 27th because of distemper. Ms. Clark was concerned about letting her other neighbors know of distemper within the City. She noted her dogs never leave her yard and she was not sure where they got distemper. She suspected her neighbor who had a history of not taking care of her pets. She then stated she had seen the Animal Control Officer return her neighbor's dogs to their yard several times in the past six months. She wanted to know why her neighbor was not cited since the ordinance states a citation would be issued after the first warning. She added her neighbor was probably not even aware that her dogs had been getting out since the Animal Control Officer didn't even leave a note or anything. She also wondered how come her neighbor was not charged with Cruelty to Animals when her animal died after being returned to her a while back. She then showed a newspaper article about her neighbor having forty-two (42) pets at one time, before the Animal Control Officer at that time took all

but three away. Mr. James Gillis expressed his shock to hear anyone could have so many animals on one lot. Mrs. Doris Middleton sympathized with Ms. Clark over the loss of her pet. Mr. Claude Rains inquired if the City required pets to be registered and vaccinated. Ms. Clark stated yes, the City requires for you to register your pet, but only requires rabies vaccination. She added she learned the hard way to give her pets all the vaccinations. Mayor Pickens stated the City did not have an Animal Control Officer when he was elected. He added there was no money in the budget either. Once in office, he saw there was a problem so the Council put money in the budget. Then Eddie Proctor went to school to be the Animal Control Officer. There wasn't much money in the budget so he was not a full-time officer. We have put in the kennel, but we only have four pens. Many times the kennel is full and we can't take anymore animals. Then we lost Eddie. We hired another employee and sent her to school; again not a full-time officer. The truck with the cage used to patrol died and she was without a vehicle. She used her personal vehicle to pick-up animals. We have recently had another truck donated by a citizen to use for animal control. Hopefully, Glenn will have it running soon so she can start patrolling again. He stated we were trying to get a veterinarian to come and conduct a clinic. He added flyers would be distributed with the date and time. He noted last years budget only had \$400 for animal control to purchase cages, traps, etc. This year the Council put \$1,000 in the budget for animal control. Ms. Sarah Crawford asked what can people do about strays, which come into their yards. Mayor Pickens stated anytime there is a threat or danger of a vicious dog to call City Hall or Burnet County after hours so an officer could be dispatched. Ms. Linda Clark stated that if more fines were imposed then more money would come in to help with costs. Mayor Pickens stated we do the best we can with what we have. We just can't afford a full-time Animal Control Officer. Mr. James Gillis asked if this ordinance covered fowl. He noted the parrot was still giving them trouble in Castle Terrace. Connie Capone stated she had not received any complaints since she last spoke with Mrs. Slaton about her parrot so she assumed the trouble had stopped. Mr. Gillis stated he would fill out a complaint form. Mayor Pickens stated Robert Pope was not an Animal Control Officer, he only fills in when Connie is not available. He added Robert's main concern is to keep water flowing into the City. At that time, several citizens thanked both Connie and Robert for doing more than one job. Mayor Pickens thanked Ms. Clark for bringing this issue forward. He stated the Council does pay attention to citizen concerns. He added they would like to do more, just limited to what they can do.

5. **CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY TAKE ACTION ON A REQUEST BY MS. SARAH CRAWFORD FOR A VARIANCE FROM ORDINANCE NO. 031193, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS, PROHIBITING CERTAIN ANIMALS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS:** Mayor Pickens stated in the past the Council had granted variances for FFA projects. He added he felt it was important to support the children in the community. Then Ms. Morgan Crawford stated she had been keeping her goat, Little Bit, in Lake Travis. She wanted to keep her closer to home so she could work with her more often. Now, she can only work with her on the weekends, which is not enough to train her. Commissioner Pfeifer asked if Morgan had a pen for her goat. Morgan stated yes, but that Little Bit never left her side when she was around. Commissioner Pfeifer asked if she was prepared to groom her and get her ready for the show. Morgan stated that yes she was learning how to groom and train Little Bit to get her ready to show. Commissioner Phipps told Morgan to make sure her pen stays clean. Morgan said she would. Commissioner Pfeifer then made a motion to approve the request for a variance to Ordinance No. 031193 to allow Morgan Crawford to have a goat within the City. Commissioner Phipps seconded his motion, which carried.
6. **CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY TAKE ACTION ON A REQUEST BY MR. BENTLEY MARTIN FOR A FIVE FT. (5') VARIANCE TO THE SETBACK REQUIREMENT IN ORDINANCE NO. 061898, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS, REQUIRING UNIFORM APPLICATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF DULY RECORDED RESTRICTIONS AND ZONING AFFECTING THE USE OF REAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A COMMUNITY CHURCH ON LOTS 495, 496, 553, & 554 IN THE SCARLET OAKS SECTION, COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS:** Mayor Pickens introduced Mr. Bentley Martin with the Cottonwood Community Church. Mr. Martin stated they were finally ready to start construction on the church. He noted to meet handicap codes and to avoid some larger trees they needed a variance to the setback requirement. He added that since it was on corner lots they didn't have enough room to allow thirty-foot on all sides. They needed a five-foot variance on all three sides

to allow them to construct a larger facility. Commissioner Pfeifer stated he had no objection to granting a variance. Commissioner Phipps stated she didn't either. Commissioner Pfeifer then made a motion to approve Item 6 on the agenda granting a variance to the setback requirement to allow the construction of a community church on Lots 495, 496, 553, & 554 in the Scarlet Oaks Section. Commissioner Phipps seconded his motion, which carried.

7. **CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY TAKE ACTION ON A REQUEST BY MR. KEITH PATSCHKE FOR A VARIANCE TO ORDINANCE NO.060799, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION AND PERMITTING OF SIGNS TO ALLOW FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN OFF-PREMISE SIGN ON A PORTION OF LOT 35 IN THE CASTLE ACRES RESUBDIVISION:** Mayor Pickens stated Mr. Keith Patschke presented an application for an off-premise sign at the corner of RR 2147 and Wirtz Dam Road. It was not in compliance with the City's ordinance because it would be located to close to an existing off-premise sign. However, it would be an attractive sign made of wood and stone; it would not be another billboard. Commissioner Pfeifer stated he had seen the drawing and it should look nice. He then made a motion to approve granting a variance for an off-premises sign on Lot 35 in Castle Acres Resubdivision. Commissioner Phipps seconded his motion, which carried.
8. **CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY TAKE ACTION ON AMENDING THE CONTRACT FOR TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL OF WASTEWATER BETWEEN LAKE LBJ MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT AND THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS:** Mayor Pickens stated the City had reached the capacity allowed on the original contract between Lake LBJ MUD and the City. He added he was not sure what the original amount of wastewater was since the meter was faulty, but a new meter had been installed which showed the City to be over the amount allowed. He noted the proposed amended contract had more fees involved and he was not sure how to pay for those fees. He stated he had discussed this proposal with the City's attorney and he suggested setting down with the board members of Lake LBJ MUD to go over amending the contract and arranging payments. Mrs. Rains asked if the public could attend this meeting. Mayor Pickens stated the meeting would be open to the public. Mrs. Rains asked if notice would be given as to the date and time. Mayor Pickens replied yes. Then Commissioner Phipps made a motion to authorize a meeting with Lake LBJ MUD to discuss amending the contract for treatment and disposal of wastewater. Commissioner Pfeifer seconded her motion, which carried.
9. **CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY TAKE ACTION ON ENTERING INTO A USER SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH HACH COMPANY FOR MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF TESTING AND MONITORING EQUIPMENT USED AT THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT:** Mayor Pickens stated this was a yearly agreement for professionals to calibrate instruments used at the water plant. He noted the City had to have this equipment in good working condition. He added we could prepay in advance and save some money. Commissioner Pfeifer stated he had done this before. He then made a motion to approve entering into a service contract with HACH to maintain equipment at the plant. Commissioner Phipps seconded his motion, which carried.
10. **MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORTS:**
 - A. **POLICE DEPARTMENT:** Chief Reeh read the report for the Police Department. He stated October had been a slow month. However, he noted they had picked-up three abandoned vehicles.
 - B. **PUBLIC WORKS:**
 - (1) **WATER & SEWER SYSTEM PERFORMANCE & USAGE:** Robert Pope read the report for the Water Department. He noted the plant was having problems with the Llano River coming down. He added most water plants are having the same trouble with the turbidity. He noted there were no problems with the lift stations. He stated the guys had been doing right-of-ways and clearing lots. He added hopefully, Glenn would be out on the streets in a little while.
 - (2) **ANIMAL CONTROL:** Connie Capone read the report for Animal Control. She stated she had been busy.
 - C. **CIVIC PRIDE:** Mayor Pickens stated Mrs. Claudie Short had not been well. Then Mr. Euclid Phipps gave the presentation.

(1) **UPCOMING MEETING DATES:** Mr. Phipps stated Civic Pride meets on the second Monday of each month here at the Civic Center. The next meeting would be December 11, 2000 at 7:00 p.m.

(2) **FUTURE PROJECTS:** Mr. Phipps stated they were hoping to put up a sign at Noah Thompson Park, but with the bids they were getting they would have to raise more money or do something different. He encouraged everyone to attend next meeting to help come up with some ideas.

11. MAYOR'S REPORT:

A. UPDATE ON WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS GRANT: Mayor Pickens stated there had been a lot of activity in Castle Terrace. They brought in lots of steel, equipment and a big crane to start working on standing the tank. He added it shouldn't take long once they get started. Mr. Claude Rains stated that since they moved the rocks up there water runs straight into his driveway. He added it had washed the dirt out of the wall into his circle drive. He wondered if there was any way to haul some in. Mayor Pickens stated when they were done he planned on landscaping around that area which should help with drainage.

B. UPDATE OF SEWER PROJECT IN CASTLE TERRACE: Mayor Pickens stated the sewer project was 95% complete. They have already started reseeding the area so we should see grass growing soon. He noted it had not been determined what the connection fees and recovery fees would be just yet. He added there would be public meetings when the fees are set.

C. FUTURE GRANT APPLICATION FOR WATER DISTRIBUTION LINES: Mayor Pickens stated he went to Austin to plead for funds to install additional water lines. There were 37 cities requesting funds and only 17 will be funded. Hopefully, we will receive the grant funds, which would mean tax money coming back into the community. Ms. Linda Clark asked if the City had to repay the grant. Mayor Pickens explained that the City would be responsible for the \$25,000 matching funds, but didn't have to repay any of the grant money awarded.

12. CITIZEN COMMENTS: Mr. James Gillis asked if the water restrictions had been lifted. Mayor Pickens stated yes and thanked everyone for their cooperation during the drought situation. Mr. Euclid Phipps asked if would be possible to put a blinking light by the hole on Lakeview Drive. He was concerned about someone getting hurt or having a car wreck there at night. Mayor Pickens stated he would see what he could do. He added he did receive an insurance notice from Bay Maintenance, which hopefully meant they would be out soon.

13. ADJOURNMENT: Mayor Pickens adjourned this Regular Meeting at 8:37 p.m.

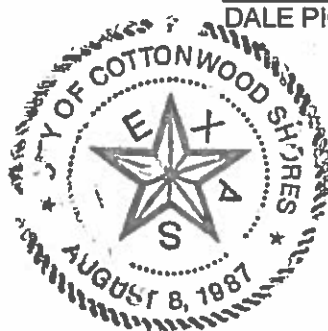
