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The City of Cottonwood Shores Commissioners convened in a Workshop Meeting April 30, 1990 at 6.00 p.m.. Those present were Leon Upshaw Mayor; Adrian Gawlik, Commissioner 1; and Mike Butler, Commissioner 11.

AGENDA

Agenda #1. Tony Plumlee informed the city that Farmers Home could lend money at %5 for 40 years. The amount is determined by what is called "hardship cases". He felt our community would qualify, especially with the 1980 census data. It was suggested that the Community Development Grant survey could be used in order to qualify with Farmers Home. It was noted that we could work out a package that would have both water and sewage financing and that the city would have the option to not go through with the application if the city decided otherwise. Mike Butler made a motion to proceed with the application. Adrian Gawlik 2nd the motion. Motion was carried.

Agenda #2. Tony Plumlee presented the zoning map to the city. There was a question as to what Driftwood 11 should be classed as due to the mobile homes located in that section of the city. It was decided to leave the map as is and to let either home construction or mobile home be the choice of the owners.


Agenda #3. There was discussion on the amount of public hearings necessary. There had to be 3 public hearings on the passage of the Subdivision and Zoning Ordinances, a closeout public hearing to finish the Planning Grant, as well as 2 public hearings in the requirements for the Community Development Grant the city is looking into.


Bill Hennesy had a question on fir hydrants with these grants and would this be taken into consideration in the applications. It was noted that they would be included.
