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A Public Hearing was held June 20th, 1991 at 7.00 p.m.. Those present to answer any questions were Joe Beyer, Mayor: Adrian Gawlik, Commissioner 1: Mike Butler; Commissioner 11: and Tony Plumlee, Engineer for Willis Environmental Engineers.

Joseph Beyer asked for any in put into the City applying for grant funds for the 1991 Texas Department of Commerce Community Block Grant Program.

Tony Plumlee explained the reasons for our city wanting to apply for the funds and why we have a good chance at obtaining the grant. He also stated that for communities with population below 750 persons need only to match 5% or \$12,500 for a grant of \$250,000 instead of the 10% or \$25,000

A list of priority projects were given with water and sewer projects having the 1st and 2nd priority rating. More points are given for these as they are priority projects.

Water, sewer, and streets were listed as our City's needs. It was discussed that the water system was our most acute need as the letter's from the Texas Water Commission and the Texas Department of Health mandate certain repairs and improvements needed to bring the water system up to standards. It was suggested to make the mandates a part of the grant application.

Jim Smyrl stated that the application should be for the priority projects of our city which are water, sewer, streets and drainage.

Claudia Short asked if this was a full grant or a pay back grant. It was answered that this was a 95% grant with the 5% city match of funds. Claudia Short also asked about the priority and what that means. It was answered that the funds are distributed by priority projects listed each year and that points are given for the project that the city applies for funds for.

The application is to be received at the Texas Department of Commerce by August 30, 1991 by 5.00 p.m..

The city ran a survey for last years grant application and it will be good for three (3) years. Low to moderate income level for a family of four (4) is \$21,751.00.

All citizens in attendance were in agreement to apply for grant funds through the Texas Department of Commerce for improvement of the water system.
