9.7. Discussed and considered action on allocating funds for cleanup along Lakeview Drive due to flooding. As requested by Staff

Mayor Orr opened the item by advising the City Council and audience the reasoning behind this request of funding. He explained he as mayor did not have authority to spend funds over \$5,000 and any item over must go before the City Council for approval. He requested the City Council allocate funds between \$20,000 and \$25,000 dollars for disaster relief. He commented the funds would be coming out of the non-designated resources. He reminded the City Council that all checks must be approved by two City Council or the mayor and one other.

The Mayor commented on the issues of junk, fish, other animals, boats as well as other watercrafts and hazardous materials that had been dropped on the banks of the lake.

City Administrator / City Secretary Sheila C. Moore addressed the City Council with information as disposal of trash, letters that have been sent out and other methods of informative points. She advised that the city and county will be working together to fill dumpsters that were provided by the city for cleanup.

It was pointed out that these dumpsters were for cleanup from the disaster only and not new construction or rebuilding of houses. The materials placed in the dumpsters must be separated.

No animals or fish may be placed in the dumpsters; these will have to be disposed of by other means. The City Council was informed that our engineering firm ATS had agreed to do disaster assessment for the homes involved in the disaster free of charge. The city is working with ATS.

The possibility of scammers was introduced and was discussed. Contractors in the city will be registered. Boats was addressed, these should be reported to the police department with the TX Numbers if possible or other means of identification to assist in the finding of the owner(s) or removal process.

Chief Liendo again addressed the City Council and audience that if a suspicious person or vehicle is seen in the area to contact the police immediately.

The mayor advised the City Council and audience that a portion of fees for rebuilding would be removed. Fees such as for inspections that were charged to the city would not be removed.

It has also been requested to have the lights available until 11:00 PM instead of 10:00.

I plan to take further measures in the near future by posting up No Dumping Signs. As you are aware the City of Cottonwood Shores has park visitor hours, any persons found in the parks after park hours will be detained and identified.


