ORDINANCE NO. 1016

AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RETURNS OF A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR
A REFERENDUM REGARDING THE CONTINUATION OF THE COTTONWOOD
SHORES CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, a special election was held at the Burnet County Courthouse Annex, 810 Steve Hawkins Parkway, Marble Falls, Texas for the City of Cottonwood Shores, Texas on May 12, 2012 (the "Election") for the purpose of a referendum regarding the continuation of the Cottonwood Shores Crime Control and Prevention District ; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cottonwood Shores, Texas (the "Council") has reviewed and investigated all matters pertaining to the Election, including the ordering, notices, Election officers, holding the returns thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby canvasses the returns of the Election, which was submitted to all residents; and

WHEREAS, the City has diligently inquired into the poll lists and the official Election returns which were duly and lawfully provided this Council by the judges and clerks holding and conducting the Election; the poll lists and the official Election returns showing separately the votes cast in the Election; and

WHEREAS, from these returns, this Council hereby finds that the following votes were cast in the Election by voters who were resident, qualified electors of the City; and

WHEREAS, the official returns of said election have been delivered to the presiding officer of the canvassing authority and have been certified to the Council by the presiding judge of said election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES THAT:


SECTION 1. The Council officially finds, determines, and declares that the Election was duly and properly ordered; the proper Election officers were duly appointed prior to the Election; that the Election was duly and legally held; that all resident, qualified electors of the City were permitted to vote at the Election; due returns of the results of the Election had been made and delivered; and that the Council has duly canvassed such returns, all in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and of the United States of America and the calling of the Election.

SECTION 2: It is hereby found and declared that at the election described in the preamble hereto there were 32 total votes cast for the election of continuing the Crime Control & Prevention District, with two (2) cast by absentee ballot, twenty-one (21) cast

by early voting, eight (8) cast by election day voting, and that said ballots were cast as following in the number of votes indicated:



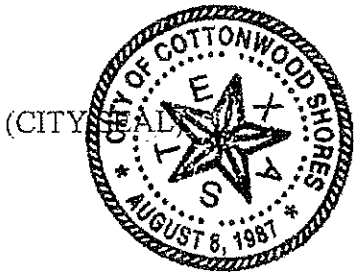

Ordinance No. 1017

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS, CONTINUING THE COTTONWOOD SHORES CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, On December 14, 2007, the City of Cottonwood Shores, Texas (the "City") City Council (the "Council") approved placing a measure on the May 12th General Election Ballot to create a Crime Control and Prevention District (the "District") and fund it with a half of one percent sales and use tax ("Sales Tax"); and

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2007, the qualified voters of the proposed District voted 73.21 percent in favor of the proposition to create the District and to adopt the proposed Sales Tax for a term of five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2012, Council adopted Ordinance 1014, calling for and ordering a Special Election for May 12, 2012, at which all qualified voters of the City would be eligible to vote for the proposition on whether the District should be continued for twenty (20) years and the Sales Tax continued for twenty (20) years, in accordance with Texas Local Government Code Section 363.251; and

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2012, the qualified voters of the District voted 74.19 percent in favor of the proposition to continue the District for a period of twenty (20) years and to continue the Sales Tax for twenty (20) years; and


WHEREAS, on May 22, 2012, Council adopted Ordinance 1016, an ordinance canvassing the special election for the referendum regarding the continuation of the District;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS:

Section 1. The Council officially finds, determines, and declares that the District is continued for twenty (20) years and the Sales Tax is continued for a period of twenty (20) years.


Section 2. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
