

ORDINANCE 1105

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS, ADOPTING AN ADMINISTRATIVE PASS THROUGH FEE FOR ALL COLLECTIONS MADE FOR OUTSIDE ENTITIES

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cottonwood Shores, Texas has determined that in order to offset higher actual cost in doing business with the public;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cottonwood Shores determined that fees collected for third parties, governmental, non-profit associations, private or commercial company or individual, or private utilities should be assessed a Pass Through Administrative Fee for the collection of said services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD SHORES, TEXAS:

1. That the City of Cottonwood Shores shall charge a fifteen percent (15%) administrative fee to all agreements to collect a fee for their service on behalf of another governmental entity, non-profit association, private or commercial company or individual or another utility and shall deduct the same from their monthly payment.
 - Exempt from this fee is all 501(c)3 organizations
2. That the City Treasurer of the City of Cottonwood Shores, Texas is hereby authorized to execute this charge.
3. That all ordinances, resolutions and orders heretofore passed, adopted and made a part of the same, which are in conflict with this Ordinance, shall be, and the same are hereby, in all things repealed to the extent that the same conflict with this Ordinance with the laws of the State of Texas.
4. That this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

PASSED AND APPROVED by the City Council of Cottonwood Shores, Texas, at a meeting on the 19th day of July, 2012 with 5 votes in favor, 0 votes against and 0 abstentions.
